

# 2017 Adequan<sup>®</sup> Global Dressage Festival Hosts Opening Press Conference in Wellington

Equestrian Sport Productions (ESP) hosted an opening press conference on Tuesday, January 10, at the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center (PBIEC) in Wellington, FL, to kick off the start of the 2017 Adequan<sup>®</sup> Global Dressage Festival (AGDF). The AGDF features the stars of dressage from Thursday, January 12, through March 25.

Tuesday's press conference panel included Equestrian Sport Productions' CEO Mark Bellissimo, AGDF Director of Sport Thomas Baur, U.S. Olympic Show Jumping Team Silver Medalist Kent Farrington, U.S. Olympic Dressage Team Bronze Medalist Kasey-Perry Glass, three-time USHJA International Hunter Derby Finals winner Liza Boyd, and Allyn Mann, Director of Adequan®.

As the AGDF circuit kicks off with its start on Thursday, AGDF Director of Sport Thomas Baur discussed exciting new additions in 2017.

"We are introducing a lot of new and exciting things at the Adequan<sup>®</sup> Global Dressage Festival this year," Baur detailed. "For the first time in a World Cup Qualifier in North America, we will use the new FEI Freestyle system where the riders have to bring in their floor plan beforehand, and the freestyle is judged according to the floor plan. The system has been used in the Western European League for qualifiers and worked out really well. The judges and riders appreciated that very much, and it will give a more objective view on the subjective freestyle for the judges."

Baur continued, "We also introduced a new spectator judging app, which has been very popular in Europe during the season, especially at the CHIO in Aachen. It is an interactive tool where the spectators can judge mark-by-mark and then compare their scores to the judges. We have introduced some new divisions for the show this year as well, including a CDI for children, and a CDIO Under 25 Nations' Cup. It is also the first time that those classes have been hosted in the Western Hemisphere. As usual, we have our four CDI-Ws, a CDI5\*, one CDI4\*, and the CDIO, which is part of the FEI Nations Cup Series."

# BROOKE USA: Honoring Yesterday's American War Horses by Helping Today's Working Equines





Throughout 2017 the United States will commemorate its World War I Centennial, marking the 100th anniversary of our entry into the war.

The U.S. shipped nearly one million horses and mules to Europe to assist the war effort. These animals carried food, water, medical supplies, ammunition, gun carriages and other supplies to the front lines. They carried men into battle and wounded soldiers to safety. They provided immeasurable support to the military, and without their loyalty and sacrifices the war's outcome could have been very different.

After having endured the horrors of war while serving alongside their soldiers, (8 million horses and mules died in WWI) most of the few surviving animals were later discarded by their armies. They were given up for slaughter or sold into lives of utter misery, to work for owners in other countries with little - if any - compassion for these faithful old warriors.

They spent the rest of their unhappy lives laboring on the foreign soil where they had previously campaigned alongside their soldiers in the bloodiest war of the century.

Dorothy Brooke discovered that several thousand former WWI horses had been abandoned in Cairo after the war, and bought back 5,000 of them.





Today the charity named in Dorothy's honor, Brooke, is the world's largest international equine welfare charity. Its American fundraising affiliate, Brooke USA, supports Brooke's equine welfare programs around the world.

For 83 years Brooke has worked in many of the poorest countries on earth to alleviate the suffering of equines on which millions of people depend, by providing scientifically proven, practical and sustainable equine welfare programs.

Last year alone, Brooke reached 2 million horses, donkeys, and mules across Asia, the Middle East, Africa and Central America, benefitting 12 million people.

Dorothy saved five thousand; with your help Brooke will reach five million. Brooke USA's Horse Heroes campaign is raising funds to support the continuation and expansion of Brooke's sustainable equine welfare programs in the world's poorest communities.

# **DREW DOGGETT** Band of Rebels: White Horses of Camargue

The Adequan® Global Dressage Festival (AGDF) is pleased to announce that select largescale works from Drew Doggett Photography's Band of Rebels: White Horses of Camargue will be exhibited at AGDF on January 13 - March 19, 2017. The all-white horses of Camargue, located in Southern France, are most identifiable by their signature color and prominent features; they are believed to be descended from prehistoric horses around 17,000 years ago. For the series Band of Rebels: White Horses of Camargue, Drew Doggett set out to document these graceful and powerful wild animals against the monotone backdrop of their remote natural habitat.

Besides their all-white coloring, the horses have a defined musculature that makes them seem otherworldly, even mystical. Their very presence on this Earth after such a considerable amount of time is enabled by a tight-knit group of caretakers, the Brotherhood of the Camargue Horsemen, also known as Gardians or 'cowboys of the Riviera,' who choose to look after them as their profession.



This Gardians role adds another dimension to the horse's fantastical narrative - one that has also helped them to continue their wild lifestyle for centuries. Since the 1500s, the Gardians have preserved the noble tradition of their caretaking, although social and economic factors have begun to adversely affect the continuation of this career.

An accompanying short film highlights the gardian's story through an intimate interview, and also features sweeping panoramas of the horses galloping through the Camargue marshlands.

Drew Doggett (b. 1984, Maryland) lives and works in Charleston, South Carolina. From 2006-2012 he worked under world-renowned fashion photographers like Mark Seliger (his former mentor), Steven Klein, Craig McDean and more. Drew left New York to travel to the Himalayas, where he decided to combine his love of photography with his passion for exploring and telling stories - all while utilizing the discipline, sympathies and skills he learned working in fashion. Since then, Drew has embarked on journeys across the globe to document extraordinary cultures and locales as both an award-winning photographer and director. He has also added a charitable component to his practice; with each new series he finds a way to give back either through sales proceeds or otherwise. His work can be found in public and private collections globally, notably the Smithsonian African Art Museum (DC). He has also been featured in many publications, most recently interviewed in Photographer Magazine and featured in Outside Magazine. He has been sponsored by brands like Hasselblad and Leica and was recently honored as an Associate from the Royal Photographic Society.

"I think it is nice that as an Olympic team we are coming back to compete on our home soil. I'm really excited about that," the rider acknowledged. "My first priority for Dublet this year is keeping him happy and healthy. Having so many competitions at AGDF makes it possible to do that because we can plan out our show schedule. Coming off the Olympics has just been a whirlwind, and I'm just excited to get back in there to compete and be with my friends. We have great sponsors, and good organizers and show management."

Allyn Mann of Adequan<sup>®</sup> has been one of AGDF's biggest supporters from the start and looks forward to another fantastic season at AGDF. The final two weeks of competition feature a CDI 4\*, presented by Havensafe Farm, on March 17-20 as well the Stillpoint Farm FEI Nations Cup, to conclude the circuit on March 30-April 2.

The finale of the season, Wellington's CDIO 3\* remains the only Nations Cup competition for dressage in the Western Hemisphere outside of championship events and is part of the FEI Nations Cup series. Each year, more international riders make the journey to compete in the coveted event. Especially in a championship year, as competitors gear up for the summer Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, riders will be looking to compete at their best against many other nations. Horses and riders from Central and South America, as well as North America and Europe will all compete for important team and individual experience.

While international-level riders are a big draw, the AGDF also hosts competition for horses and riders of varying experience. The CDI Amateur division, introduced last year, was a big success and returns in 2016. Even more classes for juniors, young riders, ponies, and young horses are on offer and make the circuit one to which any rider can aspire.
