Laura Graves and Verdades Achieve First FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI 5* Win

Laura Graves (USA) and Verdades captured another stunning victory at AGDF 5 in the4FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI 5*, presented by Diamante Farms, on Friday, February 10. This was Graves and Verdades' first win in an FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI 5* competition.

2016 Olympic Bronze Medalists Laura Graves (USA) and Verdades, a 2002 Dutch Warmblood gelding (Florett AS x Liwilarda) owned by Graves, dominated in the Global Arena once again this week, coming out on top of the competition with and for all of Florida, and it's attracting a winning score of 82.000%.

On her ride, Graves said, "The adrenaline is so high when you come out of the arena. You're so in the moment that when it's over, you kind of think, 'What just happened?' But he was great. He really feeds off of the atmosphere. He's a highly sensitive horse, and he never lets me down."

Placing second to Graves in in the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI 5* was Tinne Vilhelmson Silfven (SWE) and Paridon Magi, a 2003 Swedish Warmblood gelding (Don Primero x Napoli x Napoleon 625) owned by Lövsta Stuteri, with a score of 77.450%.

"I was pleased today with the feeling of Magi," said Vilhelmson Silfven. "He had a super warm-up and I think that when you get into this arena with this atmosphere,

it's just fun to ride. I had some small mistakes, but a very nice feeling, so overall I'm very pleased."

2016 Olympic Bronze Medalist Steffen Peters (USA) and Rosamunde, a 2007 Rhinelander mare (Rock Forever x First Lady) owned by Four Winds Farm, took third place with a 77.325%.

"I had a different strategy today," Peters said of his changed routine from Thursday. "This morning I worked her (Rosamunde) for about 45 minutes, and I walked her around all day. I had my doubts after yesterday's Grand Prix if she could handle an atmosphere like she would have to at the FEI World Cup [Finals], and tonight she proved that she might have the potential to qualify. I'm super happy. There was one 80 already in there. She had a clean test that was much more relaxed then the Grand Prix, and in this atmosphere, I'm stoked."

Devon Kane spoke on behalf of Diamante Farms, one of the founding sponsors of AGDF.

"We are very, very grateful for the riders who show up and for the owners who send the riders and everything in between that make this show so special," she said. "It's a great opportunity for us. We feel very blessed and privileged to be able to sponsor here. It's pretty phenomenal."

Judge Gary Rockwell spoke about the CDI 5* competition in Florida.

"I think it's a huge thing for this spot the best horses we have," he said. "It's fun to see these horses and riders progressing and getting better and better. We enjoy judging it. When the horses are good and the quality is good, the judging

A ceremony was also held Friday night to celebrate the official retirement of Lars Petersen's (DEN) Grand Prix mount, 1998 Danish Warmblood mare, Mariett, owned by Marcia Pepper.

Ken Braddick of dressage-news. com awarded Laura Graves (USA) and Verdades a special browband to signify their induction into the "80% Club." after her win in Thursday's FEI CDI 5* Grand Prix. The victory puts her alongside U.S. Olympic teammate Steffen Peters as a member of the "Club," which counts only 15 riders in the world as members.

WEF Sport Horse Auction Graduates Excel at Winter Equestrian Festival

Each year during the Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF), the WEF Sport Horse Auction highlights the talent and quality of a hand-selected group of VDL sport horses, sourced by VDL Stud, one of the world's most renowned show jumping and dressage breeding operations located in The Netherlands. Past auction graduates are currently competing at the highest levels of both the show jumping and hunter disciplines with professional, amateur, and junior riders.

Sabrina Lefebvre, a Canadian junior rider, purchased VDL Ferrari SMH (Bugatti VDL x Burggraaf) at the 2015 WEF Sport Horse Auction and has been pleased with progress and talent the gelding has displayed in the jumper ring. The pair competed for the first time together in the 5-Year-Old Jumper Division only two weeks after Lefebvre purchased VDL Ferrari SMH and the duo have only encountered success since.

During the 2016 season, VDL Ferrari SMH competed in the 6-Year-Old Jumper Division and finished sixth overall in the \$15,000 6-Year-Old Finals at the International CSI** at Angelstone and is currently competing with Lefebvre's trainer, Erynn Ballard, in the 7-Year-Old Division at WEF, and in the Low Junior Jumper Division with Lefebvre. Lebfebvre's ultimate goal with VDL Ferrari SMH is to compete in the High Junior Jumper Division throughout the competition

"He has impressed us at every turn. We're so happy with the progress that he's made," commented Lebfebvre. "I would highly recommend VDL horses and the WEF Sport Horse Auction for individuals looking to purchase their next top

"Everyone who was involved with the entire trial and purchasing process was amazing. Each time I see Janko [van de Lageweg] at a horse show, he always comes to see us and asks for news about Ferrari and how we're doing!"

For Side VDL, another graduate of the WEF Sport Horse Auction, shares a similar success story. Purchased by Monty and Sandy Kelly, For Side VDL (Zirocco Blue VDL x Landlord) currently competes in the 7-Year-Old Jumper Division with Mclain Ward, and is also competed by Shaine Brooks. "I have ridden him since he was four and each year he shows me more scope and energy," Brooks says. "It's very exciting and we're looking forward to the future with him."

Melanie Peterson, who organizes and manages the auction, has worked closely with the VDL organization for many years and believes that the personalities and characteristics of each graduate is what makes them unique both in and out of the competition arena.



Life After the Olympics: Steffen Peters

Steffen Peters (USA) is a four-time Olympic dressage competitor and three-time USEF Horseman of the Year. Born in Wesel, Germany, Peters emigrated to the United States in 1985, becoming a U.S. citizen in 1992. Peters helped the U.S. achieve a team bronze medal at the Atlanta 1996 Olympic Games. He also represented the United States in Beijing in 2008. placing fourth, and in London, scoring sixth in team competition. In 2016, Peters and Legolas 92 rode to another Bronze Medal finish with Team USA at the Rio Olympic Games.

What was your favorite memory from Rio, in regards to the team? Steffen: The second we knew we had won a bronze medal. From my perspective, it was 20 years for me. Of course, the U.S. had won medals in 2000 and in 2004, but for me it was 20 years. Twenty years came down to Laura [Grave]'s ride. I remember sitting there with everyone, and halfway through Laura's test I said, 'You know what, this could happen.' And then when Laura went down the last centerline, she could've screwed up every single movement, but we had the bronze medal. It's one of those things that I won't ever forget, what we did as a team.

What was your favorite Rio memory with Legolas?

Steffen: Of course, Legolas scoring a 77% in the Grand Prix with one of his best tests. It doesn't get much better than that.

What was different about Rio, in comparison to the other Olympic Games that you've been to?

Steffen: I thought that the entire venue was absolutely outstanding. There was so much more space, stalls were bigger, [and] we felt very safe because it was on the military base. I thought the arena itself was fantastic, and there was a great atmosphere. I loved the Olympic Village. We were closer to the village this time so we were able to spend a little bit more time there. Just from start to finish, there wasn't one single day where you wanted to say, 'Ok, it's time to go home.'

What is your next goal in the saddle?

Steffen: Rosie is 10 years old, and if my body holds up then I'd love to make 2020 Olympics a possibility. Right now, short term goals include the FEI World Cup Finals in Omaha. Nim Beaudoin

AGDF 6 National Wrap Up

Week 6 of AGDF featured a National Competition, presented by Adequan®, on February 17-18,

On Friday, February 17, Akiko Yamazaki (USA) and Chopin R. a 2007 gelding (Ferro), owned by Four Winds Farm, took the win in the FEI Intermediate I* AA with a score of 66.447%. Yamazaki has been to ADGF in the past as a sponsor and owner for 2016 Olympic Bronze Medalist Steffen Peters, but this is her first season competing here as a

said Yamazaki. "I've been here as a sponsor for Steffen a few times, starting with Ravel, and then Legolas and Rosie and now Bailarino. I felt that it would be so fun to be here as a rider myself. I have been able to compete at the Nationals in Kentucky twice now with Donovan, so I've had some experiences with putting a horse on a plane and competing, but coming to Florida and being in this environment is an entirely different story. I'm so glad that I realized that."

Commenting on her ride, Yamazaki said, "I'm so smiley because this was my first ride, and it was decent so I'm really happy about that. My horse, he can be quite hot. He just got here on Tuesday, so for him to just go in there and do what he did, I'm very happy with that. This was only his second I-1 test with me. I've had him since he was almost seven, so he's really a horse that we all develop together. I know that the canter still needs quite a bit of work, but with the trot I knew that we could pretty much nail everything. We needed to get all of the points possible there, so we try to get that trot as good as possible."

Placing second to Yamazaki in the FEI Intermediate I* AA was Amanda Arberman (CAN) and Santino Tyme, a 2005 Oldenburg gelding (Stedinger x Romantic Star x Rouletto) owned by Arberman, with a score of 64.868%.
